Meet the Characters





Using the Workbook

When you see Sketch sitting tall, it is time to be quiet and do your breathing exercise. Your teacher will lead you.



When you see this icon (activity) this means your teacher will be leading you through a class activity where you will be writing, drawing or responding to something.



When you see this icon (share) the activity is either done together with a few others in your class or the whole class, or you are asked to share what you write with the class.



When you see this icon (lock) the writing is designed to be private. You will not be asked to share it in class.



When you see this icon (portfolio) the activity is designed to be placed in your portfolio. Your Portfolio will be a collection of work that you will share with your friends and family at the graduation ceremony at the end of the program.



When you see this icon (word list) it signals a new word to learn. The word is defined and explained in the curriculum word list.
