
## Executive Summary Sacramento Chinese Community Service Center 2nd Semester 2016-2017 School - Year


This summary details the statistical results of the 180 Degrees Program that ended during the 2nd Semester of the 2016-2017 school year at the following 13 schools in the Sacramento area, managed by the Chinese Community Service Center:

Albert Einstein Middle School, 2 classes with 40 students American Legion High School, 1 class with 21 students Arthur Benjamin Health Professions High School, 1 class with 21 students C. K. Mc Clatchy High School, 1 class with 11 students California Middle School, 2 classes with 42 students Fern Bacon Middle School, 2 classes with 37 students Hiram Johnson High School, 1 class with 21 students John F. 
The project commenced with the beginning of the 2nd Semester, approximately February 21, 2017. The 2nd Semester ended approximately June 06, 2017. A total of 329 students enrolled in the project at 13 schools; 7 - 6th grade students, 88 - 7th grade students, 102 - 8th grade students, 27 - 9th grade students, 33 - 10th grade students, 37 - 11th grade students and 35 - 12th grade students.



The demographic make-up of the students enrolled in the 180 Degrees Program classes at the 13 participating schools the 2nd Semester of the 2016-2017 school year was as follows:



Students gender and ethnicity consisted of 177 Female (53.8%); 152 Male (46.2%); 66 African American (20.1%); 87 Asian (26.4%); 19 Caucasian (5.8%); 1 East Indian (0.3%); 101 Hispanic (30.7%); 9 Pacific Islander (2.7%); 46 other/unknown (14.0%).




Progress of the students was measured by a pre and post program comparative analysis of the students' GPA's, Core Grades (Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies and Sciences), Full Day Absences, Documented Disciplinary Incidents and Life Skills Development. The data was collected from school records and Personal Development Surveys and entered into the 180 Degrees Program Electronic Data Base. In addition, daily attendance of the students in the 180 classes was recorded and entered into the data base.

The following average results were obtained during the 2nd Semester by the 13 schools participating in the 180 Degrees Program:

The average attendance for the 329 students that remained in the program was 83.2%.

GPA's available for the 329 students that remained in the program prior to training was 2.73. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average GPA improved to 3.09, representing a **13.2% increase**.




# Core Grades

Of the 329 students completing the 2nd Semester 180 programming, the following core academic subjects listed below were graded.


## Language Arts

Grades were available for the 276 of the 329 students that remained in the Language Arts program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 2.87 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3.28, representing a **14.3% increase**.




## **Mathematics**


## Social Studies


# <u>Sciences</u>


Full Day Unexcused Absences

## **Documented Disciplinary Incidents**









## Albert Einstein Middle School in SACRAMENTO, CA; facilitator, Oscar Bermudez [ClassID=1986]

At the Albert Einstein Middle School, 20 students enrolled in the 180 Degrees Program and 20 remained active in the program at the end of the 2nd Semester of the 2016-2017 school year.

The average attendance for the 20 students that remained in the program at the end of the 2nd Semester of the 2016-2017 school year was **71.4%**.

GPA's available for the 20 students that remained in the program prior to training was 3.2. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average GPA improved to 3.54, representing a **10.6% increase**.

Grades were available for the 19 of the 20 students that remained in the Mathematics program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 2.76 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3.32, representing a **20.3% increase**.

## Social Studies

Grades were available for the 15 of the 20 students that remained in the Social Studies program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 3.5 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3.88, representing a **10.9% increase**.

#### Sciences

Grades were available for the 13 of the 20 students that remained in the Sciences program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 3.37 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3.77, representing an **11.9% increase**.

The students in the program rated themselves on an average of 3.23 before the training compared to 4.44 at the end of the training period, representing a **37.5% increase**; the facilitator rated the students in the program on an average of 3.1 before the training compared to 4.49 at the end of the training period, representing a **44.6% increase**; the teachers rated the students in the program on an average of 3.04 before the training compared to 4.72 at the end of the training period, representing a **55.2% increase**; and the parents rated the students in the program on an average of 3.3 before the training compared to 4.5 at the end of the training period, representing a **36.6% increase**.

## <u>Albert Einstein Middle School in SACRAMENTO, CA; facilitator, Oscar Bermudez</u> [ClassID=1987]

At the Albert Einstein Middle School, 20 students enrolled in the 180 Degrees Program and 20 remained active in the program at the end of the 2nd Semester of the 2016-2017 school year.

The average attendance for the 20 students that remained in the program at the end of the 2nd Semester of the 2016-2017 school year was **72.4%**.

GPA's available for the 20 students that remained in the program prior to training was 2.81. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average GPA improved to 3.15, representing a **12.1% increase.**

Of the 20 students completing the 2nd Semester 180 programming, the following core academic subjects listed below were graded.

## Language Arts

Grades were available for the 15 of the 20 students that remained in the Language Arts program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 2.92 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3.33, representing a **14.0% increase**.

#### Mathematics

Grades were available for the 13 of the 20 students that remained in the Mathematics program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 2.77 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3.29, representing an **18.8% increase**.

## Social Studies

Grades were available for the 17 of the 20 students that remained in the Social Studies program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 2.85 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3.78, representing a **32.6% increase**.

#### **Sciences**

Grades were available for the 13 of the 20 students that remained in the Sciences program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 2.23 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 2.96, representing a **32.7% increase**.

#### Full Day Unexcused Absences

Full day absences for 20 students that remained in the program were 20 the semester prior to the training compared to 5 during the 2nd Semester, representing a **75.0% decrease**.

The students in the program rated themselves on an average of 2.8 before the training compared to 3.92 at the end of the training period, representing a **40.3% increase**; the facilitator rated the students in the program on an average of 2.7 before the training compared to 3.92 at the end of the training period, representing a **45.3% increase**; the teachers rated the students in the program on an average of 2.84 before the training compared to 3.92 at the end of the training period, representing a **38% increase**; and the parents rated the students in the program on an average of 2.34 before the training compared to 3.87 at the end of the training period, representing a **65.4% increase**.

## American Legion High School in SACRAMENTO, CA; facilitator, Damien Giacchino [ClassID=1995]

At the American Legion High School, 21 students enrolled in the 180 Degrees Program and 21 remained active in the program at the end of the 2nd Semester of the 2016-2017 school year.

The average attendance for the 21 students that remained in the program at the end of the 2nd Semester of the 2016-2017 school year was **85.7%**.

GPA's available for the 21 students that remained in the program prior to training was 1.61. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average GPA improved to 2.67, representing a **65.8% increase.**

Of the 21 students completing the 2nd Semester 180 programming, the following core academic subjects listed below were graded.

## Language Arts

Grades were available for the 19 of the 21 students that remained in the Language Arts program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 2.47 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 2.74, representing a **10.9% increase**.

## Mathematics

Grades were available for the 13 of the 21 students that remained in the Mathematics program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 2.69 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3.23, representing a **20.1% increase**.

## Social Studies

Grades were available for the 14 of the 21 students that remained in the Social Studies program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 2.2 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 2.5, representing a **13.6% increase**.

## Sciences

Grades were available for the 6 of the 21 students that remained in the Sciences program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 2.67 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3, representing a **12.4% increase**.

## Full Day Unexcused Absences

Full day absences for 21 students that remained in the program were 114 the semester prior to the training compared to 38 during the 2nd Semester, representing a **66.7% decrease**.

Combined disciplinary incidents records for 21 students in the program revealed a total of 65 the semester before the training compared to 21 during the 2nd Semester, representing a **67.7% decrease.**

## Arthur Benjamin Health Professions High School in SACRAMENTO, CA; facilitator, Tristin Jenkins [ClassID=2002]

At the Arthur Benjamin Health Professions High School, 21 students enrolled in the 180 Degrees Program and 21 remained active in the program at the end of the 2nd Semester of the 2016-2017 school year.

The average attendance for the 21 students that remained in the program at the end of the 2nd Semester of the 2016-2017 school year was **76.9%**.

GPA's available for the 21 students that remained in the program prior to training was 3.17. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average GPA improved to 3.42, representing a **7.9% increase.**

# C. K. Mc Clatchy High School in SACRAMENTO, CA; facilitator, Maria Luna [ClassID=2003]

At the C. K. Mc Clatchy High School, 11 students enrolled in the 180 Degrees Program and 11 remained active in the program at the end of the 2nd Semester of the 2016-2017 school year.

The average attendance for the 11 students that remained in the program at the end of the 2nd Semester of the 2016-2017 school year was **89.2%**.

GPA's available for the 11 students that remained in the program prior to training was 1.97. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average GPA improved to 2.27, representing a **15.2% increase**.

## Core Grades

Of the 11 students completing the 2nd Semester 180 programming, the following core academic subjects listed below were graded.

#### Language Arts

Grades were available for the 6 of the 11 students that remained in the Language Arts program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 2.17 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3, representing a **38.2% increase**.

#### **Mathematics**

Grades were available for the 8 of the 11 students that remained in the Mathematics program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 1.5 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 2.25, representing a **50.0% increase**.

#### Social Studies

Grades were available for the 9 of the 11 students that remained in the Social Studies program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 2.22 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 2.56, representing a **15.3% increase**.

#### Sciences

Grades were available for the 3 of the 11 students that remained in the Sciences program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 2.67 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3, representing a **12.4% increase**.

## Full Day Unexcused Absences

Full day absences for 11 students that remained in the program were 38 the semester prior to the training compared to 4 during the 2nd Semester, representing an **89.5% decrease**.

Combined disciplinary incidents records for 11 students in the program revealed a total of 4 the semester before the training compared to 3 during the 2nd Semester, representing a **25.0% decrease.**

the end of the training period, representing a **9.6% increase**; the teachers rated the students in the program on an average of 3.13 before the training compared to 3.48 at the end of the training period, representing an **11.3% increase**; and the parents rated the students in the program on an average of 2.97 before the training compared to 3.28 at the end of the training period, representing a **10.4% increase**.

## California Middle School in SACRAMENTO, CA; facilitator, Pauline Posadas [ClassID=2006]

At the California Middle School, 19 students enrolled in the 180 Degrees Program and 19 remained active in the program at the end of the 2nd Semester of the 2016-2017 school year.

The average attendance for the 19 students that remained in the program at the end of the 2nd Semester of the 2016-2017 school year was **84.6%**.

GPA's available for the 19 students that remained in the program prior to training was 3. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average GPA improved to 3.3, representing a **10.0% increase**.

## Core Grades

Of the 19 students completing the 2nd Semester 180 programming, the following core academic subjects listed below were graded.

#### Language Arts

Grades were available for the 14 of the 19 students that remained in the Language Arts program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 2.98 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3.3, representing a **10.7% increase**.

## Mathematics

Grades were available for the 19 students that remained in the Mathematics program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 2.63 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 2.89, representing a **9.9% increase**.

#### Social Studies

Grades were available for the 15 of the 19 students that remained in the Social Studies program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 3.15 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3.47, representing a **10.2% increase**.

#### Sciences

Grades were available for the 17 of the 19 students that remained in the Sciences program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 3.26 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3.63, representing an **11.3% increase**.

The students in the program rated themselves on an average of 4.26 before the training compared to 4.38 at the end of the training period, representing a **2.8% increase**; the facilitator rated the students in the program on an average of 4.19 before the training compared to 4.25 at the end of the training period, representing a **1.5% increase**; the teachers rated the students in the program on an average of 3.94 before the training compared to 4.28 at the end of the training period, representing an **8.5% increase**; and the parents rated the students in the program on an average of 3.81 before the training compared to 4.02 at the end of the training period, representing a **5.5% increase**.

# California Middle School in SACRAMENTO, CA; facilitator, Pauline Posadas [ClassID=2007]

At the California Middle School, 23 students enrolled in the 180 Degrees Program and 23 remained active in the program at the end of the 2nd Semester of the 2016-2017 school year.

The average attendance for the 23 students that remained in the program at the end of the 2nd Semester of the 2016-2017 school year was **94.2%**.

GPA's available for the 23 students that remained in the program prior to training was 3.19. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average GPA improved to 3.54, representing an **11.0% increase**.

# Core Grades

Of the 23 students completing the 2nd Semester 180 programming, the following core academic subjects listed below were graded.

## Language Arts

Grades were available for the 19 of the 23 students that remained in the Language Arts program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 3.38 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3.82, representing a **13.0% increase**.

#### **Mathematics**

Grades were available for the 18 of the 23 students that remained in the Mathematics program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 3.26 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3.6, representing a **10.4% increase**.

#### Social Studies

Grades were available for the 18 of the 23 students that remained in the Social Studies program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 3.5 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3.96, representing a **13.1% increase**.

#### Sciences

Grades were available for the 18 of the 23 students that remained in the Sciences program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 3.56 prior to the training. At the end of the 2nd Semester, their average improved to 3.94, representing a **10.7% increase**.

Full day absences for 23 students that remained in the program were 18 the semester prior to the training compared to 1 during the 2nd Semester, representing a **94.4% decrease**.

Combined disciplinary incidents records for 23 students in the program revealed a total of 0 the semester before the training compared to 0 during the 2nd Semester, representing a **0.0%** change.

## Personal Development Surveys
