
Executive Summary Sacramento Chinese Community Service Center 3rd Trimester 2016-2017 School - Year


This summary details the statistical results of the 180 Degrees Program that ended during the 3rd Trimester of the 2016-2017 school year at the following 9 schools in the Sacramento area, managed by the Chinese Community Service Center.

Camellia Basic Elementary School, 2 classes with 54 students Caroline Wenzel Elementary School, 2 classes with 52 students Earl Warren Elementary School, 4 classes with 87 students John Bidwell Elementary School, 2 classes with 52 students John Still K-8 School, 4 classes with 79 students Martin Luther King Jr. K-8 School, 4 classes with 94 students Nicholas Elementary School, 5 classes with 106 students Pacific Elementary School, 2 classes with 47 students Woodbine Elementary School, 2 classes with 50 students


The project commenced with the beginning of the 3rd Trimester, approximately April 01, 2017. The 3rd Trimester ended approximately June 06, 2017. A total of 621 students enrolled in the project at 9 schools; 164 - 3th grade students, 157 - 4th grade students, 147 - 5th grade students and 153 - 6th grade students.



The demographic make-up of the students enrolled in the 180 Degrees Program classes at the 9 participating schools the 3rd Trimester of the 2016-2017 school year was as follows:



Students gender and ethnicity consisted of 311 Female (50.1%); 310 Male (49.9%); 141 African American (22.7%); 7 American Indian (1.1%); 141 Asian (22.7%); 25 Caucasian (4.0%); 3 East Indian (0.5%); 248 Hispanic (39.9%); 2 Middle Eastern (0.3%); 14 Pacific Islander (2.3%); 40 other/unknown (6.4%).



Progress of the students was measured by a pre and post program comparative analysis of the students' GPA's, Core Grades (Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies and Sciences), Full Day Absences, Documented Disciplinary Incidents and Life Skills Development. The data was collected from school records and Personal Development Surveys and entered into the 180 Degrees Program Electronic Data Base. In addition, daily attendance of the students in the 180 classes was recorded and entered into the data base.

The following average results were obtained during the 3rd Trimester by the 9 schools participating in the 180 Degrees Program:

SCCSC collected data from elementary sites using a trimester schedule Behaviors Contributing to Learning utilizing the following scale: O - Outstanding = 3; S - Satisfactory = 2; N - Needs Improvement = 1.

At the end of the third trimester, in addition to recording Behaviors Contributing to Learning, SCCSC reported the collective average grades of the students comparing the end of the first trimester to the end of the third trimester. The following grading rubric and grading scale was used:

A = Advanced (180 GPA equivalent = A/4)

P = Proficient (180 GPA equivalent = B/3)

B = Basic (180 GPA equivalent = C/2)

BB = Below Basic (180 GPA equivalent = D/1)


FBB = Far Below Basic (180 GPA equivalent = F/0)

The following average results were obtained during the 3rd trimester by the 9 schools participating in the 180 Degrees Program:

The combined average rating of the Behaviors Contributing to Learning of the participating students in 27 of the classes at the beginning of the first trimester of the 2016-17 academic school - year was 3.11. During the third trimester of the 2016-17 school - year, their average combined rating for Behaviors Contributing to Learning increased to 3.75, representing a **20.6% increase**.

The average attendance for the 621 students that remained in the program was 91.1%.

GPA's available for the 621 students that remained in the program prior to training was 2.49. At the end of the 3rd Trimester, their average GPA improved to 2.89, representing a **16.1% increase**.




Core Grades

Of the 621 students completing the 3rd Trimester 180 programming, the following core academic subjects listed below were graded.


Language Arts

Grades were available for the 611 of the 621 students that remained in the Language Arts program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 2.39 prior to the training. At the end of the 3rd Trimester, their average improved to 2.83, representing an **18.4% increase**.




Mathematics


Social Studies


<u>Sciences</u>


Full Day Unexcused Absences

Documented Disciplinary Incidents







At the Camellia Basic Elementary School, 24 students enrolled in the 180 Degrees Program and 24 remained active in the program at the end of the 3rd Trimester of the 2016-2017 school year.

The average attendance for the 24 students that remained in the program at the end of the 3rd Trimester of the 2016-2017 school year was **97.0%**.

GPA's available for the 24 students that remained in the program prior to training was 2.82. At the end of the 3rd Trimester, their average GPA improved to 3.08, representing a **9.2% increase.**

The students in the program rated themselves on an average of 3.63 before the training compared to 3.74 at the end of the training period, representing a **3.1% increase**; the facilitator rated the students in the program on an average of 4.03 before the training compared to 4.34 at the end of the training period, representing a **7.5% increase**; the teachers rated the students in the program on an average of 3.97 before the training compared to 4.63 at the end of the training period, representing a **16.7% increase**; and the parents rated the students in the program on an average of 3.97 before the training compared to 4.55 at the end of the training period, representing a **14.6% increase**.

Camellia Basic Elementary School in SACRAMENTO, CA; facilitator, Tori Horton [ClassID=2037]

At the Camellia Basic Elementary School, 30 students enrolled in the 180 Degrees Program and 30 remained active in the program at the end of the 3rd Trimester of the 2016-2017 school year.

The average attendance for the 30 students that remained in the program at the end of the 3rd Trimester of the 2016-2017 school year was **88.3%**.

GPA's available for the 30 students that remained in the program prior to training was 2.9. At the end of the 3rd Trimester, their average GPA improved to 3.2, representing a **10.3% increase**.

Caroline Wenzel Elementary School in SACRAMENTO, CA; facilitator, Stephanie Vega [ClassID=2050]

At the Caroline Wenzel Elementary School, 22 students enrolled in the 180 Degrees Program and 22 remained active in the program at the end of the 3rd Trimester of the 2016-2017 school year.

The average attendance for the 22 students that remained in the program at the end of the 3rd Trimester of the 2016-2017 school year was **92.5%**.

GPA's available for the 22 students that remained in the program prior to training was 2.13. At the end of the 3rd Trimester, their average GPA improved to 2.84, representing a **33.3% increase.**

The average attendance for the 22 students that remained in the program at the end of the 3rd Trimester of the 2016-2017 school year was **96.1%**.

GPA's available for the 22 students that remained in the program prior to training was 2.56. At the end of the 3rd Trimester, their average GPA improved to 2.9, representing a **13.3% increase.**

Earl Warren Elementary School in SACRAMENTO, CA; facilitator, Morgan Shipley [ClassID=2043]

At the Earl Warren Elementary School, 19 students enrolled in the 180 Degrees Program and 19 remained active in the program at the end of the 3rd Trimester of the 2016-2017 school year.

The average attendance for the 19 students that remained in the program at the end of the 3rd Trimester of the 2016-2017 school year was **89.1%**.

GPA's available for the 19 students that remained in the program prior to training was 2.38. At the end of the 3rd Trimester, their average GPA improved to 2.83, representing an **18.9% increase.**

At the Earl Warren Elementary School, 21 students enrolled in the 180 Degrees Program and 21 remained active in the program at the end of the 3rd Trimester of the 2016-2017 school year.

The average attendance for the 21 students that remained in the program at the end of the 3rd Trimester of the 2016-2017 school year was **95.2%**.

GPA's available for the 21 students that remained in the program prior to training was 2.38. At the end of the 3rd Trimester, their average GPA improved to 2.7, representing a **13.4% increase.**

Grades were available for the 13 of the 21 students that remained in the Social Studies program, revealing an average starting baseline GPA of 2.46 prior to the training. At the end of the 3rd Trimester, their average improved to 2.69, representing a **9.3% increase**.
